


NOTICE OF MEETING

The Board of Directors of First Colony Levee Improvement District of Fort Bend County, Texas will hold a regular meeting on **Friday, June 21, 2024, at 1:30 p.m.**, at the offices of Allen Boone Humphries Robinson LLP, 3200 Southwest Freeway, **Suite 2400, Pecos Conference Room**, Houston, Texas, to discuss and, if appropriate, act upon the following items:

1. Public comments.

3. Tax assessment and collection matters, including delinquent tax collections, installment agreements, and payment of tax bills.
4. Authorize delinquent tax attorney to proceed with collection of delinquent taxes.
5. MS4 Storm Water Management Plan implementation.

8. Authorize auditor to conduct audit for fiscal year end July 31, 2024.

 - c. Evaluate outfall closures on Oyster Creek;
 - d. easements and deeds;
 - e. authorize design, approve plans and specifications, authorize advertisement, award contract, and approve pay estimates and change orders for construction and maintenance projects in the district, including:
 - i. Safety, Monitoring and Operational Upgrades at Outfall Structure; and
 - ii. Hardening of Levee Tops and Headwall Improvements at Cross Lake Blvd.
13. Fort Bend Economic Development Council meetings and updates, NFIP legislation, flood management conferences, and approve all reimbursements to directors, as well as:
 - a. National Flood Insurance Program Community Rating System and Risk Rating 2.0.

14. Emergency action planning.
15. Parks and Recreational matters, including engaging landscape architect agreement, if needed and any planning proposals.
16. Adopt Resolution Establishing Additional Out-of-District Meeting Place(s).
17. Agenda items for next meeting.
