#### HARRIS COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT NO. 569

Minutes of the Meeting of Board of Directors February 12, 2024

The Board of Directors (the "Board") of Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 569 (the "District") met in regular session, open to the public, on February 12, 2024, in accordance with the duly posted Notice of Public Meeting, and the roll was called of the duly constituted members of the Board, as follows:

all of whom were present with the exception of Director Pecina, thus constituting a quorum.

Also present were: Blair Bozoarth of Quiddity Engineering, LLC ("Quiddity"); Jennifer Abad of Municipal Accounts & Consulting, L.P. ("MA&C"); Mitchell Neupert of Robert W. Baird & Co., Inc. ("Baird"); Dana Hollingsworth of Municipal District Services, LLC ("MDS"); Patty Rodriguez of BLICO, Inc., dba Bob Leared Interests ("BLICO"); Trey Patronella of Kudela & Bernheimer ("K&W"); Laci Hamilton of KGA DeForest Design, LLC ("KGA"); and Christina Cole and Kris Eddlemon of Schwartz, Page & Harding, L.L.P. ("SPH").

The President called the meeting to order and declared it open for such business as might regularly come before the Board.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

There were no comments from members of the public.

#### **MINUTES**

The Board considered the minutes of its meeting held on January 8, 2024. After discussion regarding the minutes previously forwarded for review, it was moved by Director Norris, seconded by Director Luton and unanimously carried, that said minutes be approved, as written.

#### TAX ASSESSOR-COLLECTOR'S REPORT

Ms. Rodriguez presented to and reviewed with the Board a written Tax Assessor-Collector Report ("TAC Report"), for the period ended January 31, 2024, including the disbursements presented therein for payment from the District's tax account, a copy of which TAC Report is attached hereto as **Exhibit A**. After discussion, on motion made by Director Norris, seconded by Director Luton and unanimously carried, the Board approved the TAC Report and authorized the

payments listed therein.

### <u>ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION CONCERNING DEVELOPED DISTRICT STATUS FOR</u> <u>2024 TAX YEAR</u>

Ms. Cole advised the Board that the procedures involved in setting a tax rate each year applicable to a particular district will depend, in part, upon whether it is determined to be a "Developed District" pursuant to Texas Water Code Section 49.23602. Ms. Cole then reviewed with the Board a worksheet completed by Quiddity to assist the Board in making this determination, along with a Resolution Concerning Developed District Status for the 2024 Tax Year, attached hereto as **Exhibit B**. She advised the Board that, pursuant to said worksheet, the District is not a "Developed District" under said law. Following discussion, upon motion made by Director Norris, seconded by Director Luton and unanimously carried, the attached Resolution was adopted by the Board.

#### SILT SOLUTIONS, INC.

Ms. Cole next addressed the Board concerning the District's engagement of Silt Solutions, Inc. to provide storm water pollution prevention services for the District. After discussion, it was moved by Director Norris, seconded by Director Luton and unanimously carried, that the Board (i) approve the Service Agreement between the District and Silt Solutions, Inc., a copy of which is attached hereto as **Exhibit C**, and (ii) authorize the President and Secretary to execute same on behalf of the Board and the District.

#### **OPERATOR'S REPORT**

Ms. Hollingsworth presented to and reviewed with the Board the Operations Report dated February 12, 2024, a copy of which is attached is attached hereto as **Exhibit D**. She noted that no Board action was required in connection with the Operations Report at this time.

Ms. Cole discussed with the Board the requirements of Title 30, Section 288.30 of the Texas Administrative Code for retail public water suppliers such as the District to review and, if appropriate, revise their Drought Contingency Plan (the "DCP") not later than May 1, 2024, and every five years thereafter. She requested that the Board consider authorizing MDS and Quiddity to review the District's DCP for any required updates. After discussion, Director Norris moved that MDS and Quiddity be authorized to review the District's DCP for any required updates. Director Luton seconded the motion, which unanimously carried.

### VARIOUS AGREEMENTS IN CONNECTION WITH THE DISTRICT'S PROGRAM FOR PAYMENT OF WATER BILLS BY CUSTOMERS

Ms. Hollingsworth then discussed agreements in connection with the District's program for payment of water bills by customers. Following discussion, Director Norris moved to approve and authorize the President and Secretary to execute the (i) Heartland Payments Systems, LLC's Bill Pay Merchant Setup Form and Government and Education Merchant Processing Agreement, (ii) Payment Services Agreement between First Mobile Trust, LLC ("FBS") and the District, (iii)

FBS Addendum to Merchant Processing Agreement, and (iv) Central Bank's Electronic Lockbox Payment Service documents, subject to SPH's review. Director Luton seconded the motion, which unanimously carried.

#### **ENGINEERING REPORT**

Mr. Bozoarth presented to and reviewed with the Board an Engineering Report dated February 12, 2024, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit E, relative to the status of various engineering and construction projects within the District. Upon review, Director Norris moved that the Board: (i) authorize Ouiddity to award construction contracts, subject to SPH's review of the payment and performance bonds and insurance certificates submitted in connection with the contracts to determine if the payment and performance bonds and insurance meet the requirements of the bid specifications, the Texas Insurance Code, the rules of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality ("TCEQ"), the provisions of the Texas Water Code and Astro Sunterra's and Sunterra 6A-Katy, L.P. ("Beazer"), as applicable, execution of the special conditions of the contracts under which Astro Sunterra or Beazer, as applicable, guarantees payment of all sums due thereunder, for the construction of: (a) paying facilities to serve Sunterra Section 57 to the lowest qualified bidder, Daco Paving, Inc., in the amount of \$659,000.00; (b) paving facilities to serve Sunterra Section 58 to the lowest qualified bidder, Daco Paving, Inc., in the amount of \$1,002,000.00; (c) water, sanitary sewer, and drainage facilities to serve Sunterra Section 59 to the lowest qualified bidder, Principal Services, Ltd., in the amount of \$829,584.45, as it would be most advantageous to the District and would result in the most economical completion of the project; (d) water, sanitary sewer, and drainage facilities to serve Sunterra Section 60 to the lowest qualified bidder, Blazey Construction Services, LLC, in the amount of \$845,482.90; and (e) water, sanitary sewer, and drainage facilities to serve Sunterra Section 62 to the lowest qualified bidder, Fellers & Clark, LP, in the amount of \$1,624,000.00; (ii) approve (a) Pay Estimate 3 and Final in the amount of \$228,761.80 and Change Order No. 1 in the amount of -\$46,249.75 from Dimas Bros. Construction for construction of water, sanitary sewer, and drainage facilities serving Sunterra Section 36; and (b) Pay Estimate No. 4 in the amount of \$8,433.00 from A&M Contractors, Inc. for construction of paving facilities to serve Sunterra Section 52; and (iii) authorize Quiddity to coordinate with MDS to prepare and submit the District's Water Usage Reporting Form to the West Harris County Regional Water Authority. Director Luton seconded said motion, which unanimously carried.

### ANNUAL REVIEW OF SURVEY OF WAGE RATE SCALES AND ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION ADOPTING PREVAILING WAGE RATE SCALE FOR CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

Ms. Cole presented to the Board for review and approval a Resolution Adopting Prevailing Wage Rate Scale for Construction Projects (the "Resolution"), attached hereto as **Exhibit F**. She reviewed various provisions of the Resolution with the Board. Ms. Cole also presented and reviewed with the Board a survey which reflected prevailing wage rates for Harris County and the U.S. Department of Labor. After discussion and consideration of the survey and the proposed Resolution, Director Norris moved (i) that the Board adopt the Resolution reflecting the wage rates for Harris County, as set out on the attached survey, and (ii) that the President and the Secretary

be authorized to execute and attest same on behalf of the Board and the District. Director Luton seconded said motion, which unanimously carried.

#### LANDSCAPE ARCHITECT REPORTS

Ms. Hamilton presented to and reviewed with the Board a monthly report prepared by KGA regarding the status of construction of the Sunterra Recreation Center Facility, a copy of which is attached hereto as **Exhibit G**. Following discussion, Director Norris moved to approve: Pay Estimate Nos. 8 and 9 in the amounts of \$634,533.29 and \$556,798.72, respectively, from Millis Development and Construction, LLC for construction of the Sunterra Recreation Center Facility. Director Luton seconded said motion, which unanimously carried.

Mr. Patronella presented to and reviewed with the Board a monthly report prepared by K&W regarding the status of various projects in the District, a copy of which report attached hereto as **Exhibit H**. Following discussion, Director Norris moved to approve the action items requested by K&W, including authorization to design the landscape improvements for Sunterra Sections 57-58 and 62 and to approve the pay applications and change orders listed in the K&W report. Director Luton seconded said motion, which unanimously carried.

#### **BOOKKEEPER'S REPORT**

Ms. Abad then presented to and reviewed with the Board the Bookkeeper's Report, dated February 12, 2024, attached hereto as **Exhibit I**, including the disbursements presented for payment, as prepared by MA&C. After discussion, it was moved by Director Norris, seconded by Director Luton and unanimously carried, that the Bookkeeper's Report be approved and the disbursements identified in the Bookkeeper's Report be authorized for payment.

#### AMENDMENT TO OPERATING BUDGET

The Board deferred amendment of the operating budget for fiscal year ending May 31, 2024.

#### **DEVELOPER'S REPORT**

It was noted that a developer representative was not present at the meeting.

#### **DISTRICT INSURANCE POLICIES**

As the next order of business, the Board considered a renewal proposal for the District's insurance coverage. Ms. Cole presented and discussed with the Board a renewal insurance proposal from McDonald & Wessendorff Insurance ("M&W"), a copy of which is attached hereto as **Exhibit J**, relative to various coverages as reflected therein. After discussion on the matter, Director Norris moved that the proposals for general liability, Director's position schedule bond, directors' and officers' liability, and public employee blanket crime be approved, the Texas Ethics Commission Form ("TEC") 1295 provided by M&W be approved, and SPH be authorized to acknowledge receipt of same with the TEC. Director Luton seconded said motion, which unanimously carried.

#### SECURITY PATROL REPORT

Ms. Cole presented to and reviewed with the Board the Security Patrol Report prepared by On-Site Services, LLC for the month of January 2024, a copy of which is attached hereto as **Exhibit K**.

#### **ATTORNEY'S REPORT**

The Board considered the attorney's report. In connection therewith, Ms. Cole advised the Board that she had nothing further to discuss with the Board of a legal nature which was not covered under a specific agenda item.

#### **FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS**

The Board considered items for placement on future agendas. No items were requested to be added to future agendas other than those items discussed hereinabove.

#### **ADJOURNMENT**

There being no further business to come before the Board, on motion made by Director Norris, seconded by Director Luton, and unanimously carried, the meeting was adjourned.

Section 1: For the tax year 2024, and in reliance upon the information contained in the attached Exhibit "A", the Board has determined that it shall not be considered a Developed District as defined by Texas Water Code Section 49.23602(a)(1) for any purposes. This determination shall be considered made by the Board as of January 1<sup>st</sup> of such tax year.

Section 2: This Resolution constitutes official action by the Board concerning determination of the District's Developed District status for the tax year 2024, and the District's tax assessor – collector, attorneys and other consultants shall be entitled to rely upon this Resolution in performing any actions and/or preparing any notices which are required as a result of the District's determination for such tax year, unless and until this Resolution is revoked or amended by the Board.

#### SERVICE AGREEMENT

This Service Agreement (this "Agreement") is effective as of the 26th day of January, 2024 by and between Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 569, a political subdivision of the State of Texas (the "District"), a conservation and reclamation district and a body politic and a political subdivision of the State of Texas, created under the authority of Article XVI, Section 59 of the Texas Constitution and operating under and governed by the provisions of Texas Water Code, as amended (the "Owner"), and Silt Solutions, Inc (the "Contractor").

#### **RECITALS**

WHEREAS, the Owner has determined it is in the Owner's best interest to engage a professional service provider for the services described herein; and

WHEREAS, the Parties have read and understood the terms and provisions set forth in this Agreement and have been afforded a reasonable opportunity to review this Agreement with their respective legal counsel;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises, mutual promises, covenants, obligations and benefits herein contained, the Owner and Contractor agree as follows:

### SECTION I. SERVICES

Section 1.01. Services. Contractor shall perform maintenance of District facilities services (the "Services") for the Owner as authorized from time to time by written task orders ("Task Orders") approved by Owner's Board of Directors (the "Board"), and Contractor shall be compensated for such Services as approved by the Board. Contractor may not deviate from approved Services without the prior written consent of the Board. Task Orders shall be evidenced by a written proposal or service order, which shall include the Services to be performed, the location, and the fees. Currently approved Task Orders are attached hereto as Exhibit A. Nevertheless, all proposals or service orders of the Contractor that are approved by the Board are governed by the terms of this Agreement even if such proposal or service order does not expressly reference or is not attached to this Agreement. Any additional Task Order shall be approved by the Board and added as another exhibit to this Agreement, signed and dated by Owner and Contractor. The exhibits added shall be sequenced in alphabetical order beginning with Exhibit B and shall be dated when approved by the Board. All fees described in the Task Orders shall include charges for labor, materials, insurance, equipment and any other items required to perform the work in the Services. The terms of this Agreement shall supersede any standard or preprinted terms appearing on the

face or reverse side of any Task Order, and the Services authorized by each Task Order shall be subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

### SECTION II. COMPENSATION

Section 2.01. Payment for Services. Contractor shall submit a detailed monthly invoice (together with any back-up documentation requested by the Owner) indicating the Services performed for that month under the terms of this Agreement. Contractor shall submit detailed invoices to the Owner's bookkeeper:

Payment shall be made within forty-five (45) days of the approval of Contractor's invoice by the Owner. Interest shall not be paid on service invoices.

Contractor agrees that upon completion of the work called for hereunder, it will furnish the Owner with proof, satisfactory to the Owner, that all labor, material and equipment for which Contractor has been paid, have been satisfied and paid, unless the Owner waives such proof. Upon furnishing such proof, or waiver thereof, the amount billed by Contractor will be reviewed by the Owner for approval and all undisputed amounts shall be paid to Contractor in accordance with this Section.

### SECTION III. GENERAL CONDITIONS

Section 3.01. Contractor's Duties. Contractor covenants with the Owner to furnish its best skill and judgment in performing the Services for the Owner. Contractor agrees to furnish efficient business administration and superintendence and to use its best efforts to furnish at all times an adequate supply of workmen, materials and equipment and to perform the Services in the most expeditious and economical manner. Contractor agrees to exercise reasonable diligence in performing the Services, using the degree of care and skill that a prudent person in the same or similar profession would use.

Section 3.02. Relationship of Owner and Contractor. Contractor has been retained by the Owner for the sole purpose and to the extent set forth in this Agreement. It is understood and agreed that all work so done by Contractor shall meet with Owner approval, but that the detailed manner and method of performing the Services shall be under the control of Contractor. Contractor's relationship to the

Owner during the term of this Agreement is that of an independent contractor. The relationship between the Owner and Contractor is not exclusive.

Section 3.03. Insurance. Before commencing any work hereunder, Contractor shall furnish certificates of its insurance and copies of any required endorsements to the Owner evidencing the following insurance coverage, which coverage shall be maintained throughout the term of this Agreement. Certified copies of each policy shall be furnished to the Owner upon the Owner's request. Contractor shall not violate or knowingly permit to be violated any condition of the insurance policies required by this Agreement. Nothing contained in this Section shall limit or waive Contractor's legal or contractual responsibilities to the Owner or others. Cancellation or expiration of any of said insurance policies shall not preclude the Owner from recovery thereunder for any liability arising under this Agreement.

Contractor shall obtain the following insurance from companies having a Best's rating of B+/VII or better and licensed to transact business in the State of Texas:

- A. Workers' Compensation Insurance covering liability arising out of Contractor's employment of workers and anyone for whom the employer may be liable for workers' compensation claims at limits as imposed by statute. Workers' compensation insurance is required, and no alternative forms of insurance shall be permitted.
- B. Employer's Liability Insurance Limitations with limits of not less than \$500,000.
- C. Commercial General Liability Insurance with limits not less than:
  - 1. Each occurrence \$1,000,000
  - 2. General aggregate \$2,000,000
  - 3. Products-Completed Operations Aggregate \$2,000,000
  - 4. Personal & Advertising Injury \$1,000,000
- D. Comprehensive Automobile Liability Insurance with limits not less than \$1,000,000 (combined).
- E. Excess Liability: \$2,000,000 \$2,000,000.

Contractor's insurance shall include the following endorsements:

A. The Owner and the Owner's agents and employees shall be added as additional insureds to all coverage required under this Agreement for all liability arising out of Contractor's work under this Agreement, except for workers' compensation insurance, as to the full limits of liability provided by each insurance policy (including limits greater than the minimum limits required herein).

- B. All required insurance shall be endorsed to provide that coverages afforded under the policy will not be canceled or modified without at least seven (7) days prior written notice to the Owner. Renewal certificates shall be provided at least seven (7) days prior to the termination date of the current certificates of insurance during the term of this Agreement.
- C. Inasmuch as Owner and Contractor intend that all of Contractor's insured loss and liabilities fall upon Contractor's insurers, without recourse against Owner, Contractor agrees to cause all of its policies of insurance maintained in force or procured by Contractor to provide, if necessary by endorsement, that each such insurer fully waives subrogation against the Owner and its agents and employees.
- D. All of the aforesaid policies shall be endorsed to provide that the coverage provided to the Owner as an additional insured will be on a primary basis, and not in excess of other insurance coverage available to the Owner, and that neither Contractor nor its insurer will seek contribution or recovery from the Owner or such other insurance available to the Owner.
- E. Contractor shall cause its subcontractors, including all persons hired by Contractor who are not Contractor's employees, who perform any part of the work hereunder, to be added as additional insureds to all coverage required under this Agreement, as to the full limits of liability provided by each insurance policy (including limits greater than the minimum limits required herein).

### Section 3.04. Indemnification.

TO THE FULLEST EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, THE CONTRACTOR, FOR ITSELF AND ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, AGREES TO DEFEND, INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS THE OWNER AND ITS OFFICERS, DIRECTORS, REPRESENTATIVES, AND AGENTS, FROM EVERY LOSS, DAMAGE, INJURY, COST, EXPENSE, CLAIM, JUDGMENT, OR LIABILITY OF EVERY KIND OR CHARACTER (INCLUDING SPECIFICALLY ATTORNEYS' FEES, COURT COSTS AND OTHER EXPENSES INCURRED IN ENFORCING THIS INDEMNITY PROVISION), WHETHER IN CONTRACT, TORT, OR OTHERWISE, WHICH ARISES DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY FROM THE CONTRACTOR'S WILLFUL, INTENTIONAL, RECKLESS OR NEGLIGENT (WHETHER ACTIVE, PASSIVE, OR GROSS) ACTS OR OMISSIONS RELATED TO OR ARISING FROM THIS AGREEMENT. THIS INDEMNITY AND HOLD HARMLESS PROVISION WILL APPLY WHETHER SUCH ACTS OR **OMISSIONS** ARE CONDUCTED BY THE CONTRACTOR OR ANY SUBCONTRACTOR OR AGENT OF THE CONTRACTOR.

THIS INDEMNITY AGREEMENT IS INTENDED TO MEET THE TEXAS "EXPRESS NEGLIGENCE RULE" BECAUSE CONTRACTOR AGREES THAT IT

APPLIES AND IS ENFORCEABLE EVEN AS TO LOSSES, DAMAGES, INJURIES, EXPENSES, CLAIMS, CAUSES OF ACTION, JUDGMENTS OR LIABILITIES JOINTLY OR CONCURRENTLY CAUSED BY THE NEGLIGENCE OR OTHER FAULT OF THE OWNER. THE TERM "FAULT" IN THE PREVIOUS SENTENCE INCLUDES THE VIOLATION OR BREACH BY THE OWNER OF ANY COMMON LAW DUTY, ANY TERM OF THIS AGREEMENT, OR ANY STATUTE OR REGULATION.

THIS INDEMNIFICATION OBLIGATION IS IN ADDITION TO ALL OTHER LEGAL, EQUITABLE, OR INDEMNIFICATION REMEDIES AVAILABLE TO THE OWNER. THIS INDEMNIFICATION OBLIGATION SURVIVES THE TERMINATION OR EXPIRATION OF THIS AGREEMENT.

CONTRACTOR DOES HEREBY WAIVE, RELEASE AND FOREVER RELINQUISH AND DISCHARGE THE OWNER FROM ALL OF CONTRACTOR'S CAUSES OF ACTION ARISING FROM BODILY INJURY OR DEATH OR DAMAGE TO ANY PROPERTY ARISING OUT OF THE WORK, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THE INJURY OR DAMAGE IS CAUSED IN FULL OR IN PART BY THE NEGLIGENCE OR OTHER FAULT OF THE OWNER.

Section 3.05. Term and Termination. Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time, without cause, upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party. Contractor shall not be entitled to any payment or further payment other than for work performed or material, equipment, or supplies furnished prior to such termination. The Owner does not waive any other remedy allowed under Texas law.

<u>Section 3.06. Agreement Controls.</u> To the extent that there is any inconsistency between the provisions of this Agreement and any attachments or exhibits hereto, the terms of this Agreement shall control.

Section 3.07. Regulatory Requirements. All work will be done in strict compliance with all applicable city, county, state and federal rules, regulations and laws and any codes which may apply to the Services being provided. Contractor will obtain all permits and licenses required to perform the Services and will be responsible for securing inspections and approvals of its work from any authority having jurisdiction over Contractor's Services.

Section 3.08. Safety and Health Standards. Contractor shall observe and comply with all applicable federal, state and local health and safety laws and regulations.

Section 3.09. Inspection. The Owner and its duly authorized representatives shall have the right to inspect all Services being performed hereunder at any time. Contractor agrees to maintain adequate books, payrolls and records satisfactory to the Owner in connection with any and all Services performed hereunder and to maintain such books, payrolls and records for at least four years. The Owner and its duly

authorized representatives shall have the right to audit such books, payrolls and records at any reasonable time or times.

Section 3.10. Warranty. In addition to other common law and statutory warranties, whether implied or express, Contractor's warranty applies to materials, parts, labor and workmanship for one (1) year from the date of completion of the Service. Contractor shall transfer all manufacturers' warranties to the Owner.

Section 3.11. Assignability. Contractor shall not assign its rights or obligations or any sum that may accrue to it hereunder without the written consent of the Owner, which shall be granted or denied in the Owner's sole discretion.

Section 3.12. Modifications. This Agreement shall be subject to amendment, change or modification only with the prior mutual written consent of the Owner and Contractor, except to add any future exhibits pursuant to Section 1.01.

Section 3.13. Force Majeure. In the event either party to this Agreement is rendered unable, wholly or in part, by force majeure including an act of God; strikes; lockouts, or other industrial disturbances; acts of the public enemy; orders of any kind of government of the United States or the State of Texas or any civil or military authority (other than a party to this Agreement); insurrections; riots; epidemics; landslides; lightning; earthquakes; fires; hurricanes; storms; floods; droughts; arrests; civil disturbances; explosions; or other inability similar to those enumerated; to carry out its obligations under this Agreement, it is agreed that party shall give written notice of such act to the other party as soon as possible after the occurrence of the cause relied on and shall, thereafter, be relieved of its obligations, so far as they are affected by such act, during the continuance of any inability so caused, but for no longer.

<u>Section 3.14.</u> Agreement Subject to Applicable Law. This Agreement and the obligations of the Parties hereunder are subject to all rules, regulations and laws which may be applicable by the United States, the State of Texas or any other regulatory agency having jurisdiction.

Section 3.15. Governing Law. This Agreement is governed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and shall be enforceable exclusively in the state court in the county in which the Owner is located.

Section 3.16. Waiver. No waiver or waivers of any breach or default by a party hereto of any term, covenant or condition or liability hereunder of performance by the other party of any duty or obligation hereunder will be deemed a waiver thereof in the future, nor will any such waiver or waivers be deemed or construed to be a waiver of subsequent breaches or defaults of any kind, character or description, under any circumstances.

<u>Section 3.17. Intended Beneficiaries.</u> This Agreement is for the sole and exclusive benefit of the Owner and Contractor and will not be construed to confer any benefit upon any other party.

Section 3.18. Severability. The provisions of this Agreement are severable, and if any provision or part of this Agreement or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is ever held by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional for any reason, the remainder of this Agreement and the application of such provision or part of this Agreement to other persons or circumstances will not be affected hereby.

Section 3.19. Fossil Fuels Boycott Verification.

As required by 2276.002, Texas Government Code, as amended, Contractor hereby verifies that Contractor, including any wholly owned subsidiary, majority-owned subsidiary, parent company or affiliate of the same, does not boycott energy companies, and will not boycott energy companies during the term of this Agreement. As used in the foregoing verification, "boycott energy companies" shall have the meaning assigned to the term "boycott energy company" in Section 809.001, Texas Government Code, as amended.

Section 3.20. Firearms Discrimination Verification.

As required by Section 2274.002, Texas Government Code, as amended, Contractor hereby verifies that Contractor, including any wholly owned subsidiary, majority-owned subsidiary, parent company or affiliate of the same, (i) does not have a practice, policy, guidance or directive that discriminates against a firearm entity or firearm trade association, and (ii) will not discriminate against a firearm entity or firearm trade association during the term of this Agreement. As used in the foregoing verification, "discriminate against a firearm entity or trade association" shall have the meaning assigned to such term in Section 2274.001(3), Texas Government Code, as amended.

Section 3.21. Israel Boycott Verification

As required by Chapter 2271, Texas Government Code, as amended, Contractor hereby verifies that Contractor, including any wholly owned subsidiary, majority-owned subsidiary, parent company or affiliate of the same, does not boycott Israel and will not boycott Israel through the term of this Agreement. As used in the foregoing verification, the term "boycott Israel" has the meaning assigned to such term in Section 808.001, Texas Government Code, as amended.

Section 3.22. Anti-Terrorism Representation

Pursuant to Chapter 2252, Texas Government Code, Contractor represents and certifies that, at the time of execution of this Agreement neither the Contractor, nor any wholly owned subsidiary, majority-owned subsidiary, parent company or affiliate of the same, is a company listed by the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts under Sections 2270.0201 or 2252.153 of the Texas Government Code.

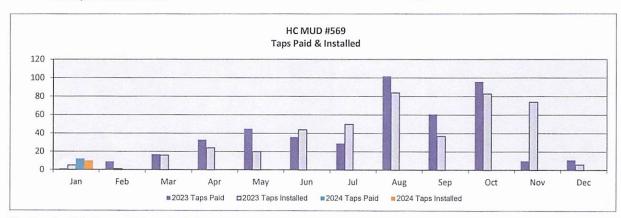

The terms for four directors (Eric Hansen, Precinct 3; Douglas C. Postle, Precinct 6; Gary Struzick, Precinct 7; and Mark G. Janneck, Precinct 8) of the Authority's Board of Directors (the "Board") expire in May, 2024. Please see the attached Director Precinct List (attached as Exhibit "C") to determine in which precinct your district/municipality is located. (If your district/municipality is not listed on the attached Director Precinct List or if your district/municipality has had a boundary change and you believe it may now be located in a different precinct, please notify Alia Vinson, attorney for the Authority, by facsimile at (713) 860-6649 immediately (but no later than January 31, 2024) so that you can be notified in which precinct your district/municipality is located. Failure to do so may prevent your district/ municipality from participating in the 2024 director appointment process.) If your district/municipality is located in Precincts 3, 6, 7, or 8, you may take action regarding the 2024 director appointment process and must submit a completed 2023 Water Usage Form, as more fully described below in Section A. If your district/municipality is located in Precincts 1, 2, 4, 5, of 9 you have no action to take regarding the 2024 director appointment process, but you must submit a completed 2023 Water Usage Form, as more fully described below in Section B.

#### A. Instructions For Precincts 3, 6, 7, and 8

The districts and municipalities within Precincts 3, 6, 7, or 8 have the right to cast their vote during the 2024 director appointment process for the appointment of director positions for such precincts. The strength of the vote of each district/municipality within a precinct is calculated by dividing the total water (other than Waller County water) used within the precinct by the district/municipality in calendar year 2023 by the total water (other than Waller County water) used by all districts/municipalities in that precinct in calendar year 2023, multiplying that quotient by 100, and rounding that result to the nearest tenth.

If a district/municipality within Precincts 3, 6, 7, or 8 desires to nominate a candidate for a position on the Board, the district/municipality is required to nominate such person by resolution (using the form attached as Exhibit "A") and to submit the name of the candidate to the presiding officer of the Authority by Thursday, February 15, 2024.

A district/municipality may nominate only one candidate and the candidate must be nominated for the precinct in which the district/municipality is located. A district/municipality within Precincts 3, 6, 7, or 8 seeking to nominate a candidate must complete and provide by February 15, 2024, the Resolution Nominating a Candidate and Certification of Resolution Nominating a Candidate attached hereto as Exhibit "A" to Eric Hansen, President, West Harris County Regional Water Authority, c/o Alia Vinson, Allen Boone Humphries Robinson LLP, 3200 Southwest Freeway, Suite 2600, Houston, Texas 77027; Facsimile: (713) 860-6649. The district/municipality is responsible to ensure that the Authority actually receives the fully completed Exhibit "A" Resolution Nominating a Candidate and Certification of Resolution Nominating a Candidate at the above address or fax number no later than 11:59 p.m., February 15, 2024.

The legislation governing the Authority provides that to be eligible to serve as a director, or to be listed on a ballot as a candidate for director, an individual must:

- (1) be at least 18 years of age;
- (2) be a resident of the State of Texas;
- (3) own land or be a qualified voter within the director precinct that he or she would represent; and
- (4) have served as a director of one or more districts for a total of four years or more, or for a precinct in which the City of Katy is located, the individual may have served as the Mayor or member of City Council of Katy for any period.

Please note that if the candidate is currently serving on a utility district board of directors, he or she will be required to resign from such position if appointed to the Authority's Board of Directors. If the candidate is currently serving on the board of a governmental entity that is not a utility district, he or she may be required to resign from such position if appointed to the Authority's Board of Directors.

Districts/municipalities within Precincts 3, 6, 7, or 8 are required to report their water usage to the Authority by March 1, 2024, on the form attached hereto as Exhibit "B" to: Eric Hansen, President, West Harris County Regional Water Authority, c/o Cheryl Panozzo, Allen Boone Humphries Robinson LLP, 3200 Southwest Freeway, Suite 2600, Houston, Texas 77027; Facsimile: (713) 800-1168. Districts/municipalities within Precincts 3, 6, 7, or 8 are responsible to ensure that the Authority actually receives a fully completed Exhibit "B" Water Usage Reporting Form at the above address or fax number no later than 11:59 p.m., March 1, 2024. Without timely receipt of an accurate, fully completed Exhibit "B," the Board cannot accurately calculate the water usage and voting strength of a district/municipality and the district/municipality may lose its right to vote in the 2024 director appointment process. In the event that the information provided on the Water Usage Reporting Form is inconsistent with the information obtained by the Authority, including through meter reads or the Automatic Meter Reading system, the Authority reserves the right to correct such usages for the purposes of calculating water

usage and voting strength. It is very important that all districts/ municipalities within the Authority complete the Water Usage Reporting Form and provide it by March 1, 2024, even if districts/municipalities do not intend to vote in the 2024 director appointment process because the data is needed for groundwater reduction plan purposes.

Districts/municipalities are responsible to ensure that the Authority actually receives the resolution casting its vote for director at the above address or fax number no later than 11:59 p.m., April 30, 2024.

## RESOLUTION ADOPTING PREVAILING WAGE RATE SCALE FOR CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

WHEREAS, Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 569 (the "District") has been heretofore duly created and organized; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 2258, Texas Government Code ("Chapter 2258"), requires the District to determine the general prevailing rate of per diem wages for each craft or type of worker in the locality in which a construction project for the District is to be performed and the general prevailing rate of per diem wages for legal holiday and overtime work; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 2258 provides that a worker employed on a construction project by or on behalf of the District shall be paid not less than said general prevailing rates, as applicable; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 2258 provides that a contractor which is awarded a construction contract for the District, or a subcontractor of the contractor, shall pay not less than the rates determined as set forth above to a worker employed in the execution of such contract for a construction project; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 2258 applies to construction projects paid for in whole or in part from funds of the District, regardless of whether the work is done under the District's supervision or direction; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the District (the "Board") has determined the general prevailing rate of per diem wages by using the prevailing wage rate as determined by the United States Department of Labor in accordance with the Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. Section 276a et seq.), as amended, and has determined to adopt a Prevailing Wage Rate Scale for Construction Projects for the District. Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF HARRIS COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT NO. 569, THAT:

Section 1: The Board has determined the general prevailing rate of per diem wages for each craft or type of worker in the locality in which a construction project for the District is to be performed and the general prevailing rate of per diem wages for legal holiday and overtime work by using the prevailing wage rate as determined by the United States Department of Labor in accordance with the Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. Section 276a et seq.), as amended, and further, the Board has determined that the wage rates in the Prevailing Wage Rate Scale for Construction Projects (comprised of one or more United States Department of Labor wage determination scales for each project type) attached hereto as Exhibit A are the general prevailing wage rates for construction projects by or on behalf of the District.

Section 2: The District hereby adopts the Prevailing Wage Rate Scale for Construction Projects attached hereto as Exhibit A, which establishes minimum rates for each project type that

shall be used by all contractors and their subcontractors on construction projects by or on behalf of the District.

<u>Section 3</u>: A contractor or subcontractor on a construction project by or on behalf of the District shall maintain records as required by Chapter 2258 and shall be subject to the penalties, forfeitures, and withholding of money for failure to comply with this Resolution and/or pending a final determination of an alleged violation, as provided in Chapter 2258.

<u>Section 4</u>: The District engineer is hereby directed and authorized to specify the wage rates adopted hereunder for each project type in all specifications for bids and contracts for construction projects by or on behalf of the District.

<u>Section 5</u>: Any prior Resolution Adopting Prevailing Wage Rate Scale for Construction Projects previously adopted by the Board is hereby revoked.

The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.

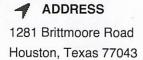

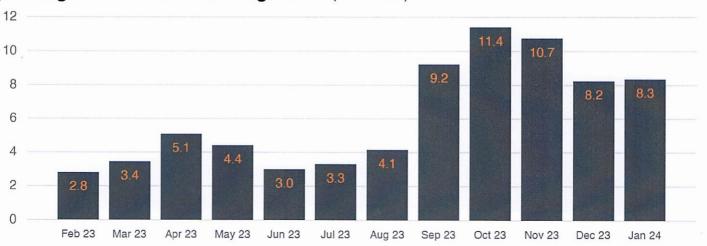

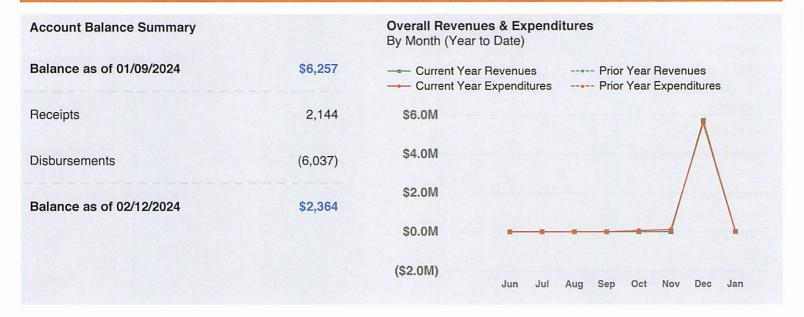

#### Account Balance By Month | February 2023 - January 2024



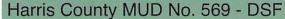

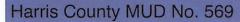

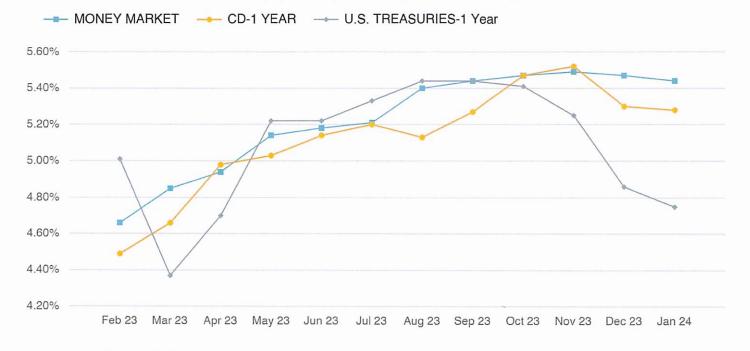

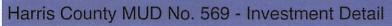

#### PRIVACY BREACH NOTIFICATION

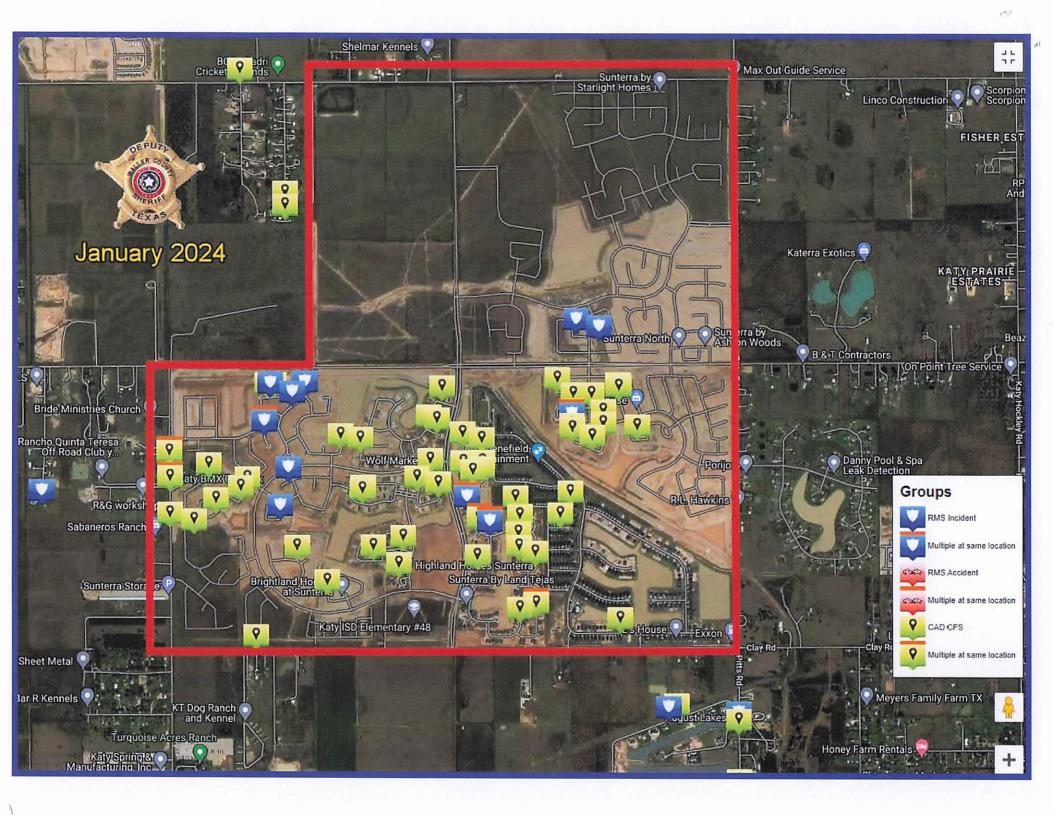
